Transfers of Firearms: I acknowledge that transferring a weapon to a person other than an immediate family member (spouse, domestic partner, child, step child) is a Crime under NYS General Business Law §898 (6), unless conducted through a duly licensed gun dealer who conducts a NiCS check on the purchaser/transferee.</p> <p>B. Straw Purchases: I acknowledge that §265.17 of the NYS Penal Law makes it a crime, punishable as a Class D Felony, to purchase or dispose of a firearm, rifle or shotgun to another knowing that he/she is disqualified from possessing said firearm.</p> <p>C. Storage of Firearms: I acknowledge that §265.45 of the NYS Penal Law prohibits, under designated circumstances, a person from storing or leaving a rifle, shotgun or firearm out of his or her immediate possession or control without having first securely locked such rifle, shotgun or firearm in an appropriate safe storage depository, or without having rendered it incapable of being fired by use of a gun locking device appropriate for said weapon. NOTIFICATION TO RECIPIENTS OF FIREARMS, RIFLES OR SHOTGUNS		
<p>A. Transfer of Firearms: Transferring a weapon to a person other than an Immediate Family Member (spouse, domestic partner, child, stepchild) is a crime under §898 of the NYS General Business Law unless conducted through a duly licensed gun dealer who conducts requisite checks on the purchaser/transferee.</p> <p>B. Straw Purchases/Transfers: It is a crime under §265.17 of the NYS Penal Law, punishable as a Class D Felony, to purchase or dispose of a firearm, rifle or shotgun to another knowing he or she is disqualified from possessing said firearm.</p> <p>C. Secure Storage of Firearms: §265.45 of the NYS Penal Law prohibits, under delineated circumstances, a person who owns or is a custodian of a rifle, shotgun or firearm from storing or otherwise leaving such rifle, shotgun or firearm out of his or her immediate possession or control without having first securely locked said rifle, shotgun or firearm in an appropriate safe storage repository or rendered it incapable of being fired by use of a gun locking device appropriate to that weapon.</p> <p>For purposes of §265.45 of the NYS Penal Law, a "safe storage repository" shall mean a safe or other secure container which, when locked, is incapable of being opened without the key, combination or other locking mechanism and is capable of preventing an unauthorized person from obtaining access to and possession of the weapon contained therein. <i>Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect, impair or supersede any special or local act relating to the safe storage of rifles, shotguns or firearms which impose additional requirements on the owner or custodian of such weapons.</i></p> <p>D. Owners or Custodians of a Rifle, Shotgun or Firearm who Reside With an Individual Under 16 Years of Age: Owners or custodians of a rifle, shotgun or firearm who reside with an individual under 16 years of age are required by law to comply with the safe storage/locking provisions detailed in "C" above.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>You are advised to obtain professional legal advice and to consult the full text of laws cited, in addition to all other applicable statutes</i></p>

Important: To facilitate the timely processing of your request, please adhere closely to the guidance provided by this form.

To initiate the release and/or transfer process, form PDCS-4227a (*Attestation for Release of Firearms from Property Section*) must be completed by the original claimant for the firearms and notarized. This form can be submitted by fax, e-mail, regular mail or in person, using the contact information below (Note: If faxed/emailed, the original form must be produced at the time of release/transfer). One PDCS-4227a is required for each person seeking to receive or transfer weapon(s). Federal Firearms Licensed Dealers ("FFL") who possess a current license need not submit this form.

After form PDCS-4227a has been received, required inquiries will be performed for all claimant-recipients of firearms, as well as for *transferees* (persons transferring firearms) and *transferees* (persons receiving firearms as part of a transfer). Appropriate parties will be notified of results, and will be contacted to schedule an appointment.

Under NYS law, firearms can only be transferred to a FFL or to an Immediate Family Member (child, step-child, spouse, or domestic partner ("in-laws" and parents do not qualify under the law). Assault Weapons cannot be transferred to an Immediate Family Member—they must be transferred to a New York State Dealer in Firearms. Note: While all NYS Dealer in Firearms are FFLs, not all FFLs are NYS Dealer in Firearms.

Note Regarding Orders of Protection and/or Family Offenses: Firearms invoiced following an allegation of a Family Offense or in connection with an Order of Protection require special processing. See Page three for guidance in these instances.
